



Activity Planning and Risk Management Checklist

The purpose of this checklist is to document necessary considerations required to undertake activities as part of the SSAA farmer Assist Program. Many of these items are outlined in the Property Based Wildlife Management Plan template that is available to use in the program booklet.

Please tick off applicable items:

- We have discussed activity objectives and responsibilities.
- A map of the property and its boundaries have been produced to ensure areas that activities can or cannot be conducted are displayed.
- We have identified potential hazards and discussed risk management measures relevant to the planned activities, including firearm safety, environmental conditions, access issues, livestock, vehicles and any other site-specific risks.
- We have discussed activity planning and scheduling (frequency and intensity of activities) to improve efficiency of on-ground activities.
- We acknowledge that the SSAA Farmer Assist program has a Code of Practice that must be adhered to and that there are certain national guidelines such as the *National Code of Practice for the Humane Shooting of Kangaroos and Wallabies for Non-Commercial Purposes* that may be relevant for certain activities.
- We acknowledge that some culling activities may require a licence or permit to be in place prior to any on-ground activities. Any pest animal that requires a valid mitigation or destruction permit from a state agency must already be approved and in possession of landholder. This type of permit is usually applied for by the landholder and the SSAA member can act (undertake culling) on behalf of the landholder.
- We acknowledge that SSAA provides its members with a \$20 million Public Liability and Personal Accident cover to protect members from legal negligence while undertaking hunting or shooting activities on both public and private property anywhere in Australia.
